Moxley Receives AAFCS Distinguished Service Award



The American Association of Family & Consumer Sciences honored it's Distinguished Service Award recipients at a ceremony during the 105th Annual Conference and Expo in St. Louis, Mo., on June 28th. Among those selected for the prestigious award was Kansas' very own Virginia Moxley.

"I am honored to be the recipient of the DSA Award. I have watched over the years the DSA recipients and been inspired by the work they have accomplished. It is with great pride that I accept this award," said Moxley.

Virginia is a professor of Family Studies and Human Services at Kansas State University, and former Dean of the College of Human Ecology. She has influenced and inspired thousands of students, faculty, staff, alumni, and colleagues through her respect for the history of the profession, her institutional and professional association leadership, and her life dedicated to service to others.

Virginia is a visionary servant leader with a distinguished career in Higher Ed and is the co-director of the Institute for Academic Alliances that provides consultation support for Higher Ed alliances nationwide. Moxley has served both AAFCS and the Kansas Affiliate through a variety of roles. Other awards and honors include AHEA Leader in 1989, National President of Omicron Nu Honor Society (now Kappa Omicron Nu), co-founder of the Undergraduate Research Community for Human Sciences, and 2009 recipient of the Public Service Award from the Association of Public and Land Grant Universities Board on Human Sciences.
